RESOLUTION 19-01-06 TO APPROVE BUDGET ALLOCATIONS FOR THE RECEIPT OF A GRANT FOR FIRE DEPARTMENT

RESOLUTION #19-01-07

POLICY FOR THE PREVENTION OF HARASSMENT, INCIVILITY AND VIOLENCE AT WORK

It is proposed by Councillor Ms. Martine Bouchard and resolved unanimously that the Council of the Town of Métis-sur-Mer adopts a policy of prevention of harassment, incivility and violence at work and asks the Director General and the Director of public works to give the policy to all employees of the municipality and to ensure the follow up.

6.2 Citizen declaration: climate emergency.

RESOLUTION #19-01-08

CITIZEN DECLARATION: CLIMATE EMERGENCY

CONSIDERING THAT the increase in the atmosphere of greenhouse gases and the increase of the average temperature of the world rapidly deregulate the climate of our planet and are in the process of compromising current and future generations;

CONSIDERING THAT all scientific studies demonstrate the need to act in order to reverse the tendency;

CONSIDERING THAT the last special report, approved on October 6 2018 by the Intergovernmental Panel on Climate Change (IPCC), the main international agency responsible for evaluating scientific activities devoted to climate changes, the consequences of these changes, the potential risks in relation with them and the measures that could be taken to restrain their effects, highlights the urgency of intervention;

CONSIDERING THAT the Town of Métis-sur-Mer, like its citizens, is conscious of the importance of rallying all political decision-makers and to demonstrate its interest in getting involved and investing in the fight against global warming climate;

CONSIDERING THAT the Town of Métis-sur-Mer has already implemented several actions aimed to protect the environment and wishes to continue its commitment.

FOR THESE REASONS,

It is proposed by Councillor Ms. Martine Bouchard and resolved unanimously:

THAT the Council of the Town of Métis-sur-Mer asks and invites the various levels of government, political parties, public and private players, to seriously consider the current state of the climate and the risks associated with the increase of the average temperature of the world in all development and growth policies and strategies;

THAT the Council of the Town of Métis-sur-Mer undertakes, through the actions of its waste management plan, to analyse the implementation of various initiatives to reduce the environmental impact, in the short, medium and long term, in its territory;

THAT the Council of the Town of Métis-sur-Mer invites various industries, businesses and institutions as well as all citizens to play a leading role in reducing greenhouse gases and other environmental impacts;

THAT this resolution be forwarded to federal and provincial government agency necessarily affected by the emergency of action to protect the Earth.
