# 5.1 Naming of a councillor to sit on the board of the Association des Residents de la Pointe du Phare de Metis-sur-Mer (ARPP).

**WHEREAS** Ms. June Smith is no longer a Councillor of the municipality and she was on the board of the Association des Résidents de la Pointe du Phare de Métis-sur-Mer (ARPP);

**WHEREAS** it would be necessary for the municipality to re-appoint a member of the municipal council to be part of the Council of the Association des Résidents de la Pointe du Phare de Métis-sur-Mer (ARPP);

#### FOR THESE REASONS,

A resolution has been adopted by the Town to, in taking account of the approval of the ARPP, appoint Councillor Ms. Martine Bouchard to be on the board of the Association des Résidents de la Pointe du Phare de Métis-sur-Mer (ARPP).

# 5.2 A thank-you to the Métis-sur-Mer Firefighters Association for the purchase of the fibreglass box for the new emergency truck.

A resolution has been adopted by the Town to thank the Métis-sur-Mer firefighters Association for their financial cooperation in order to equip the new emergency truck with a box of fiberglass specially designed for emergency service. The contribution is in the order of over \$12 000.

### 5.3 Request for authorization to hold a cycling event.

A resolution has been adopted by the Town to authorize the holding of a cycling event. This event is called "Au tour des jeunes Desjardins Bas-St-Laurent", and allows more than 200 young people from secondary 3 to 5 to cycle the road from Saint-Pascal to Matane. Cyclists will pass through our municipality Tuesday, May 22, 2018.

### 5.4 Municipality allied against domestic violence.

**WHEREAS** the Charter of Human Rights and freedoms recognizes that every human being has the right to life and to the safety, integrity and freedom of the person (section 1);

**WHEREAS** it is in the private domain that this right is most threatened for women and, in 2014, the police services of Quebec registered 18 746 cases of offences against the person in domestic context;

**WHEREAS**, since 1995, Quebec has established a policy of intervention in relation to domestic violence:

WHEREAS there is a broad consensus for equality between men and women;

**WHEREAS** despite the efforts made, domestic violence still exists, and it is an obstacle to the achievement of this equality;

**WHEREAS** during the 12-days action for the elimination of violence against women from November 25 to December 6, actions take place throughout Quebec;

**WHEREAS**, as a local government, it is necessary to support the efforts of the *Regroupement des maisons pour femmes victimes de violence conjugale et de ses maisons membres* to raise awareness among citizens against domestic violence;

### FOR THESE REASONS,

A resolution has been adopted by the Town to proclaim, "Municipality allied against domestic violence".
